In conjunction with The Nuclear-Free World Conference to be held in Hiroshima and Nagasaki, the Asia-Pacific Nuclear Victims Conference is scheduled for August 7th and 8th in Nagasaki.

The purpose of this conference is to prepare for, and work toward, the Global Radiation Victims Conference to be held from September 26th to October 3rd in New York City.

To help ensure a successful Global Conference, the Japan Preparatory Committee for the First Global Radiation Victims Conference (JPC) was formed in January of this year. JPC's functions include such important tasks as raising the public's awareness of the Nuclear Fuel Cycle and educating people about the damages caused by radiation.

JPC is hosting the Asia-Pacific Nuclear Victims Conference in order to bring together radiation victims, concerned scientists, activists and others working on nuclear-related affairs.

The Asia-Pacific region has been and still continues to be terribly affected by nuclear power. More than three-hundred nuclear bombs have been detonated. The number of nuclear power plants is increasing. And nuclear military power is spreading rapidly throughout the entire region.

JPC would like to invite all interested persons to attend the conference and exchange their views and experiences with the Nuclear Fuels/Weapons Cycle and its related technology.

The conference will contribute to the formation of a network for communication and joint action. It will also help develop an Asian-Pacific perspective to deal with the nuclearization of our Earth.

Although JPC does not have sufficient resources to fund all participants, a small amount of financial assistance, especially for radiation victims, will be available.

Also, for those unable to attend the conference, JPC would appreciate receiving papers, documents, photographs, etc., for circulation at the conference.

We are looking forward to your participation and cooperation to make these historic conferences successful and fruitful for the nuclear-free, ecologically sound future.
