The Vietnam War has not ended. It is continuing.

The Vietnamese no longer call the war 'genocide; for large areas of their land, has been bombed till nothing is allowed to grow.

Ex: The Mekong Delta, once the most populated region of the earth.

'Biocide'---the destruction of all living things. Anything to....
'break the will of the people to resist.' In America how many of us have met GI's brutalized by the war, have felt the racial hatred they bring with them.

The strategic position of Vietnam in SE Asia, the tin and Tungsten deposits American industry cannot do with out, the natural resource of rubber and the vast populations for markets and cheap labor—these are the shadows behind the war. Imperialism—in a word. The Cambodian Tactic maximized the bombing five times. And the troop withdrawals are making way for 'other troops.'

People have watched the return to power of the military families in Japan and their influence over the economy of all of SE Asia. It is called the Greater East Asia Co-Prosperity Plan. The Vietnamese call it the Nixion Doctrine---Imperialism--again. This time, Asians against Asians.

The shadow of racism so prevailant throughout the American Past is with us, here, in our streets, in our schools, in our 'friends', with all peoples whose skin has color. People of color have been stereotyped and made victims of color, of racism and especially of this war, this imperialism. We are so few in number yet can we stand by and ignore the massacre of our brothers as though it had nothing to do with our lives, our future? How can we revive the humane instincts of this bureaucratic maddness, this industrial-military giant? George C. Patton III has said of bombing, 'I love to see those arms and legs fly!'

We must stand up, we must, to show others, to show ourselves, to demand our Vietnamese brothers and all people's homeland be respected and treated with the moral and humane principles this country professes to espouse.
