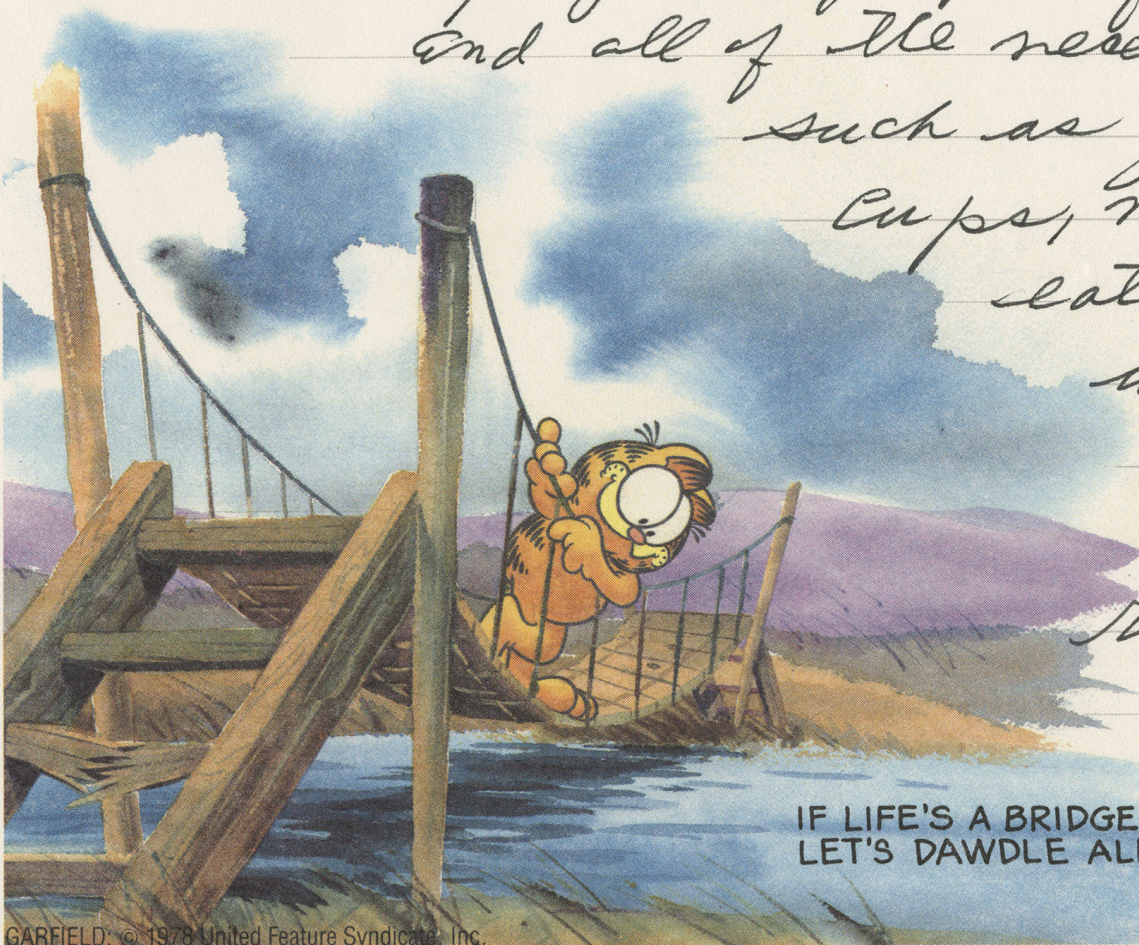
altho' I had been quite busy at this end until the night before my departure

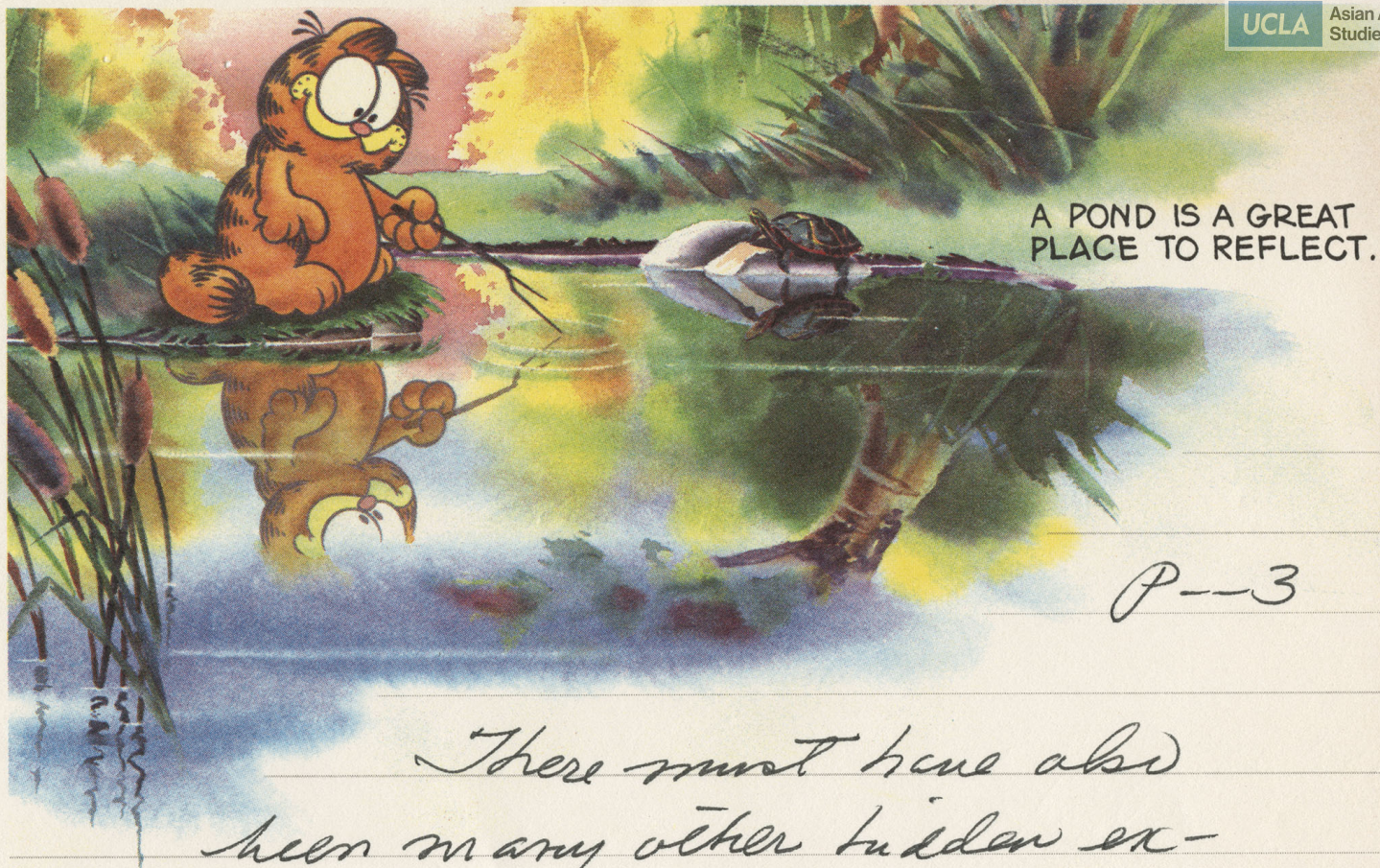


for N.Y. I really feel very grateful to all of you compassionate people who helped arrange the beautiful Memorial Service for Sammy.
