Dear Japanese American Friends:

Permit AFRAM to commend you for the successful struggle over the years to establish that the signing of Executive Order 9066 was legitimately a crime against humankind. I am reminded that, while the order also in cluded the Italians because of Mussolini's tactics, they were never interned in camps as were the Japanese Americans.

We honor you since you were able to get this nation to acknowledge publically and in its pocketbook its error. We hope that someday this country will acknowledge its error in dropping the A - Bomb on Japan in August 6, 1945.

Queen Mother: Mbore, who reached 90 years of age on July 27, 1988, has been wrging African Americans to make a public and legislative appeal for RE - PARATIONS for years. She reminded us of it again as we flew; from New York to Atlanta on Sat., July 16, 1988 - on the way to the Democratic National Convention.

Finally, your example will probably have the impact of stimulating in creased action and pressure by those of us who believe that LEGAL REPAR - ATIONS are owed to African Americans for our 'illegal 'legal' enslavement, for having been made citizens, second class, that is, without our consent and participation and for having been held as a 'captive nation' for all these years. It remains essentially illegal to be Black in America. I hope that Rev. Jesse Jackson's car never breaks down in Howard Beach with out the presence of the Secret Service.
