P.S. We are now trying to find drivers for the road-routes of the Mission. There will be nine all together, and seven are still to be found. Drivers should be over 25 and/or married (for insurance regulations); able and willing to help with local transportation, luggage, exhibits and so forth; and not only excellent drivers, but people attuned and sensitive to the project and to the problems of the hibakusha traveling through a land foreign to them. These jobs will offer only expenses -- plus, of course, a unique and gratifying experience. Six of the drivers will start when the three road teams start: May 1, St. Paul; May 5, Kansas City; May 7, Omaha; the other three will start from Los Angeles on April 26, and will drive the exhibit trailers to the various points at which they will be needed. All the drivers will be needed through the morning of June 7th, when the Mission will leave this country.
