RE : Commemoration of 40th Anniversary Hiroshima/Nagasaki

This year marks the 40th Anniversary of Hiroshima/Nagasaki. The NCCCUSA/JNAC are cooperating with Mobilization for Survival in itinerating Hibakusha in the U.S. and other means of remembering and of working toward a different kind of future.

It has been proposed that we have a chapel service to mark this anniversary. Ted Gault told me that some group (he has no record) has reserved the chapel for August 6, Tuesday. Until Carl Tiller returns on July 8 we cannot get the name of that group.

I have reserved Friday, August 9, for a possible chapel service. That day is important because on Thursday, August 8, General Secretary MAEJIMA Munetoshi of the NCC Japan arrives in New York. It would be appropriate and worthwhile to have him speak or share in the service during his Friday, August 9 visit to the NCCCUSA.

It may be that two days are worthwhile spending in commemoration. At any rate, we will have to sort this out to see when and how it is to be done.

I have also talked with the building about a small exhibit, and we are able to mount one in the room to the rear of the chapel -- what was earlier the Orthodox Room. Would it be valuable to put on display all the books we know of which are related to the atomic bombings such as John Hersey's Hiroshima, Robert Jay Lifton's Hiroshima, Poor Elephant, etc. I have many of those but if you have any please let me know.

In order to discuss plans more fully, could you meet on FRIDAY, JULY 5 at 12 noon in ROOM 603. If there are other persons you know are interested, please invite and bring them. This is an exploratory meeting to see how we can work out the plan.
