

PEACE AND FREEDOM TRAIL AND PARIS TOUR

COME TO BRUYERES, FRANCE IN JULY, 1989, TO HELP CELEBRATE THE DEDICATION OF THE "PEACE AND FREEDOM TRAIL", the French testimony to the American men of the 100th/442nd and their liberation of the French border in World War II.

On October 15, 1944, after seven years under the seige of Hitler's Germany, Bruyeres, France was liberated within four days by a group of American G.I.s who were to become the highly decorated 100th/442nd Regimental Combat Team. Now, in appreciation and commemoration, the people of Bruyeres and Biffontaine have created a Peace and Freedom Trail connecting the two towns where monuments were erected in 1947 and 1984 respectively.

The dedication of the Peace and Freedom Trail also marks the Bicentennial of the French Revolution. ~~GO~~ FOR BROKE FRENCH CLUB founder, Serge Carlesso, his protege Pierre Moulin, and the People of France, invite all generations of Nikkei to join in the celebration and to be reminded of the legacy the Nisei soldiers left behind in Europe during World War II fighting for a freedom that many of whom, themselves, had come from concentration camps in America, did not have. The trip will take place in July, 1989.

The trip coordinator is Rudy Tokiwa, 442nd veteran. All inquiries should be directed to him. All ground tours have been arranged by SIEL VOYAGES of Luxembourg - Pierre Moulin. Air arrangements have been completed by NIPPON TRAVEL AGENCY PACIFIC, INC. of Redwood City. SERGE CARLESSO of Bruyeres is the tour advisor. Pierre Moulin is also the current executive president of the GO FOR BROKE FRENCH CLUB and author of U.S. Samourais en Lorraine, a contemporary history of the Nisei and their place in French history.
