Sound of Taps

During the various eulogies paid to Dwight David Eisenhower, references were made to the major and critical events in his life.... this was as it should be. It would be fruitless for me to attempt to elaborate on what has already been said and written about this outstanding individual.

However, equally revealing of the man were the constant small accomplishments that made up his everyday life. One local radio station solicited people to call in and relate such unheralded events in the life of this great man. One of the participants talked about Eisenhower's concern for the G.I. and mentioned the famous Eisenhower jacket. This struck a response, and I couldn't help but wonder how many other ex-G.I.s must have felt the same way....especially, the Niseis. The creation of the Eisenhower jacket certainly made military life more endurable in comparison to the long-styled coat which had drooped low over the short-statured Nisei soldiers.

The 100-442nd members remember Dwight Eisenhower as our Supreme Commander....General of the Army....and later president of Columbia University where a handful of former "Go For Brokers" received

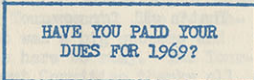
From all indications, the tournament was a great success, and many complimentary remarks have been said ...thanks for all those who helped to make it that way.

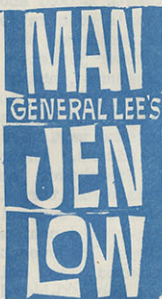

(C) Active Duty. The monthly rate for an individual who is pursuing a program of education while on active duty may not exceed the monthly rate of the cost of the course as specified in subparagraph (B). Subject to this limitation, the rate will be:

When enrollment is in a course which does not lead to a standard degree, absences in excess of the maximum number allowable will cause a reduction in the educational assistance allowance payable for the month in which such absences occurred. The rate of reduction will be determined by the following table: (June 1, 1966)

well over \$600. But thanks to all the CHAPTERS furnishing those wonderful meals, here again the Association was able to save substantially. It made me feel very proud to hear so many compliments about ALL the CHAPTERS cooperating to serve those most delicious meals. I extend my sincere thanks to all the CHAPTERS and to all those wonderful people who participated to make the meals so great. Dinner by dinner (now is the thing) there were Association members declaring a desire to change their Chapter affiliation. E Company topped off the 3 weekends with roast turkey and trimmings, along with many other delicious dishes. THANK YOU AGAIN EVERYONE.

The Association had over a dozen donors towards the purchase of the trophies that were awarded to the Tournament Champions. The clock trophies and the sponsors trophy cost \$375, so here again the savings for the Association was quite substantial. A list of all donors appears elsewhere in this issue.

Harry Oshiro of/ and Jefferson Bowl donated all the pre-tournament advertising, except for the large posters that were done by Tom Shimazu's son, Darrel. All the necessary forms that are necessary to conduct a Bowling Tournament were also donated by Harry and Jefferson Bowl. At this time the exact cost of the above is not known, but two items that are known are \$400 towards the team prize fund and \$276 from the bowling cost. The Tournament Committee gratefully acknowledges Harry Oshiro's and Jefferson Bowl's many donations. The Committee also thanks the entire staff of Jefferson Bowl for their wonderful cooperation.

As can readily be seen by the above figures, the Tournament would have relatively been a financial failure if the Association had to pay for all legitimate expenses. But because of the help that was received, the Tournament was more profitable than the original expectations for the number of entries that were received. There were 136 teams entered. 170 for Mixed Doubles and 200 for Doubles and Singles. These totals fell short of our original goals, but nevertheless, it was declared to be the largest total to participate in a Nisei Tournament in Southern California in the last five years. Final figures have not been completed but it is this writer's guess that the Association will be enriched by about \$1500 because of the Tournament.

The Tournament Committee feels that as long as help from Association members is forthcoming, the Tournament should be an ANNUAL EVENT. If this is also the desire of the Board, the Committee Members have volunteered to serve another year provided additional Association mem-

bers will volunteer to serve on the committee and/ or sub committees.
