# 2nd Battalion Special

Veterans European Pilgrimage

Sept 29: Noon departure for Los Angeles, transfer to overnight flight to Wash D.C.

<u>Sept 30:</u> AM arrival. Rest in hotel until early evening departure for Rome.

Oct 1: Early AM arrival in Rome. After clearing customs we drive south to visit Nazi and Nettuno American Cemetery. We return to Rome via Cisterna, Lanuvio, Albano. We will be staying in Rome for three nights.

Oct 2: Our excursion to southern Italy takes us to Naples and then to visit the ruins of Pompeii. Then we travel northward to visit or view some of the major battle sights of the 100 Bn up to the famous battle of Monte Cassino. We return to Rome.

Oct 3: Tour of Rome.

Oct 4: Today's journey is to the first "battle-ground" of the 442nd. We drive north through

Civitavvechia, Grosseto, and begin our visits or viewing of the battle sites from about Suverto. Familiar places we will attempt to see are Mt.. Belvedere, Sasseta, Castagneto, Monteverdi, and Bibbona. We stop for a brief visit in Cecina where men of the 100th remember marching in review to honor secretary of Stimson. Other familiar places are Hill 140, Castellina, Rosignano, Pieve San Luce, Lorenzano, and Orchiano. Men of 3rd Bn would recall Colle Salvetti from where they were able to see the tower of Pisa. We pass through Legnhorn where some members remember being part of the Guards of Honor for review before King George VI of England. After viewing the Tower of Pisa, we continue to Florence.

Oct 5: Free time in the morning in Florence to visit places of interest. Before lunch we depart southward, our first visit is the American Military Cemetery south of Florence, then to the hilltown to San Gimingnano with its ancient towers, to Volterra the beautiful hill town renown for its alabaster, then to other famous city of Siena. On our return to Florence we visit the south bank of the Arno, west of Florence where the 2nd and 3rd Bns were positioned in August of 1944.

Oct 6: Our journey takes us to the "battle sites" of the Po Valley campaign. We drive through familiar places such as Prato and Monecatini. If time permits we stop for a brief visit to the "Pinnochio Park" in Collidi, through Lucca and to Pietrasnata, the jump off point on April 4, 1945. Familiar places we will attempt to visit or view are Azzano, Montignoso, Mt. Fragolita, Massa, Frigido River and stop in Carrara where the kitchen crews were situated during the battle. From Carrara we take the road to the area of Fosdinovo and to Aulla. We will then proceed to Genoa, the home of Columbus.

Oct 7: Our journey today takes us into the post war sector of Northern Italy - Novi Ligure, the hub of activity about April 30, 1945, then to the famous violin city of Cremona where we will visit the Stradivarius Museum. We will also visit Lecco and Como. Our overnight stay is in Milan. Oct 8: During our excursion to Venice we drive through the beautiful Po Valley section of North-

ern Italy to visit Venice. We return to Milan for the night.

Oct 9: Our last day in Italy takes us to Alessandria, Asti, Alba, and Cuneo- all places familiar to the men of the 2nd Bn. After Cuneo, we drive to Ventigmilia then cross the border into France. We will make brief stops in Menton and Monte Carlo before going to Nice.

Oct 10: Our excursion today is the "battle sites" of the Maritime Alps. We travel through L'Escarene, site of Regt. HQ's, then to Col de Braus familiar to men in the Anti Tank Co. who, as part of the Allied Forces, pushed the enemy out of southern France. Then to Sospel and Pieara, Cava, "home" to the men of the 2nd and 3rd Bns for over three months.

Oct 11: We bid farewell to beautiful Nice and as we head towards Marseilles, our first stop is in "Le Muy" to visit the site of the glider landing of the men of Anti-Tank. We drive through Marseille (time permitting) and then to Avignon and northward to Grenoble or Geneva.

Oct 12: Today's journey takes us to the beautiful alpine village of Murren high above the Lauterbrunnen valley. We drive through many familiar Swiss cities to Interlaken, then to Lauterbrunnen where we board the funicular and train to Murren. If time permits, we can enjoy a optional aerial cable car ride to schilthorn, the site of the famous Piz Gloria revolving restaurant made famous in the James Bond movie.

Oct 13: We descend to Lauterbrunnen and transfer to the other side for a journey to the top of Europe, the Jungfraujock. Our cog train ride takes us to another beautiful alpine village, then through the tunnels in the Eiger Mountain to the Jungfraujock. This is a wonderful complex of ice sculptures, husky dogs, "Toporama" slide show, mountain restaurant and breathtaking views of the Alps. We descend to Grindlewald where our bus will be waiting to take us to Lucerne.

Oct 14: After our morning walking tour of Lucerne, we head westward through Switzerland and through Basel, then into France through Mulhouse to Colmar. If time permits, on our way to Colmar we will visit specialty museums.

Oct 15: Biffontaine celebration.
