51st Anniversary Memorial Service

*** THAT SOLEMN PRIDE THAT MUST BE YOURS TO HAVE LOVED SO COSTLY A SACRIFICE UPON THE ALTAR OF FREEDOM ***

These immortal words have been engraved in stone at the top of the stairs beneath the statue of *Lady Columbia* at the National Memorial of the Pacific at Punchbowl where the 51st anniversary memorial service of the 442nd Regimental Combat Team was held. President Abraham Lincoln spoke these words to a mother who had lost 5 sons in the Civil War.

We cannot fathom the grief suffered by this noble and loving mother. A nation and her people can only pay our humble respects to their gallant soldiers and to honor the memory of their great sacrifices and pray that there will be no more wars, more peace on earth and goodwill towards one another.

DR. KENNETH P. MORTIMER, UH President and Chancellor of Manoa campus, warmly encouraged the audience on the continuation of collecting oral histories citing the document that described DR. ERNEST MURAI, his father-in-law, who was one of the AJA citizens that brought support to the formation of the 442. DR. MORTIMER, graciously accompanied by his lovely wife, LORRAINE, expressed the sentiments that were possibly in the minds of veterans and their children. His entire speech is included in this GFB issue.

The Sons and Daughters chapter conducted many weekly meetings organizing the 51st anniversary events on March 26, 1994. We all now know that the 442nd offspring are dedicated to

perpetuating the legacy of the 442. To UNCLES HENRY KUNIYUKI, JIMMY MIYAKE, and STANLEY KANESHIRO, wells of tears appear whenever I reflect on the faith you bestowed on all of us. Pershing Nakada's Inurnment

The inurment of PERSHING NAKADA's remains was on April 6, 1994 at Arlington National Cemetery with full military honors. The procession was led by a horse-drawn caisson, followed by a marching unit, a band, family members, relatives, and friends. LARRY & RUTH INAGAKI, who live in nearby Bowie, Maryland, attended. The bugler playing taps concluded the short but impressive ceremony.

Sources have it that PERSHING NAKADA was the only AJA officer that commanded an U.S. military unit (232nd Combat Engineers) of any kind in WWII. Retired from the Army as a full-brid Colonel, but to the boys, he was the "Captain."
