Remainder trust benefits you and the Foundation. Sometimes investments, real property for securities that have appreciated substantially don't meet your needs as much as before. Selling them could mean a hefty capital gains tax, but here's a plan that benefits you and the Foundation. It's the charitable remainder trust, and it works like this. You donate the property or securities to the trust and receive income from it until the trust's termination date, which could be your date of death. You get a tax deduction equal to the present value of the remainder interest which the Foundation will eventually receive. At the termination of the trust, the Foundation receives the remaining assets. What kind of property makes the best gift? Appreciated property that would provide little or no income without the existence of the charitable remainder trust.
