PRELIMINARY STATEMENTS OF AADAP PHILOSOPHY, POLICIES, PRINCIPLES OF UNITY

The following is a brief and <u>rough</u> outline of the policy task force meeting of Monday, May 21. We (AADAP) are primarily a drug treatment program and our responsibility will be to treat Asian American drug abusers. However, we feel that the drug problem is not an isolated problem from other social problems (i.e., unemployment, racism, poverty, war, etc.) but a symptom or reflection of deeper contradictions within American society and its institutions.

There are many specific reasons for people to use drugs, but generally the lack of a feeling of human dignity (self-respect, self-worth, pride, identity) seems to be a primary reason why many Asian Americans resort to drugs. The causes for this feeling are many: insensitive schools stressing competition above meaningful education about our lives and history; industries more concerned about profit than human lives and values (General Motors, Ely Lilly, Dow Chemical, etc.); media and advertisers which perpetuate racist stereotypes to sell their products, and other manifestations (indications) of a system which stresses making more and more money.

*To counter profit-oriented institutions, we stress education and reeducation, a collective workstyle, realistic expectations (we are not going
to be 100% successful nor are we the final answer to the drug problem) and
a building of human dignity in our lives and our work.

The following page is a <u>beginning</u> outline of many of the points which we feel are necessary to insure a together program. <u>It is not final</u>, but a beginning towards the development of a thorough and consistent working philosophy.
