Dear Brother:

Enclosing two articles that you may be able to use in your Panther newspaper. One is the statement of the hijack of the plane to North Korea by 9 Japanese Red Army students, and the other is a Third World solidarity message by Truong Van Xe, an NLF Vietnamese, thanking Africans and Arabs for their support of the Provisional Revolutionary Government of the Republic of South Viet Nam.

The Red Army statement is very long. Perhaps you can use just the first two and a quarter pages, staying within the area of North Korea. The part about Japan's Expansion in Asia is very good, too, because it is timely with the U.S.-Japan Security Treaty.

The booklet, "Ampo Funsai," which gives a projection in the implication of the treaty, was prepared by members of the Asian Americans for Action. Hoping you can also use some of this material as this imperialists' pact will again be re-established on June 23.

There should be gigantic action by Japanese students over there. We are hoping to do something simultaneously here, though we are so small in number. At least, both in California and New York, we will launch something. We will thank you for whatever support via your paper you can give.
